Morning Workshop

Training, Supervising, & Motivating Support Staff

This workshop will describe evidence-based ways of working with support staff in human service settings. Initially, a summary of a step-wise approach to overall management of staff performance will be presented, based on behavior analysis research and application. Next, specific supervisory strategies will be described supplemented with demonstrations. Topics to be covered include how to provide competency- and performance-based training of relevant work skills to staff, monitoring staff day-to-day performance in ways that are acceptable to staff, and use of various feedback protocols to both support proficient staff performance and correct performance problems as needed. Subsequently, ways to motivate support staff in terms of promoting work diligence and enjoyment will be presented. The latter include supervisory strategies for interacting with staff that enhance work enjoyment, making less preferred work duties more desirable for staff to perform, and appropriate use of informal feedback.

Afternoon Workshop

Evidence-Based Ways to Promote Enjoyment Among People with Autism and Other Severe Disabilities

This workshop will summarize evidence-based means of working with support personnel to enhance daily enjoyment among adults with autism at the severe end of the spectrum. An overview of ways for identifying and validating indicators of enjoyment among adults with significant communication challenges will initially be presented. Next, effective strategies will be summarized for equipping staff with day-to-day approaches for promoting enjoyment among the individuals with disabilities with whom the staff work. The latter approaches will include establishing a good relationship, attending to individual likes and dislikes, and preference-based teaching for enhancing skill development in an enjoyable manner.

Presenter Biography

Dr. Dennis Reid is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst and has worked with children and adults with autism and other severe disabilities as a clinician, supervisor, and consultant for over 35 years. He has published over 100 journal articles and authored or co-authored seven books. Dr. Reid is a Fellow in the Association for Behavior Analysis International and recipient of the 2006 International Research Award of the American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. He is the founder and director of the Carolina Behavior Analysis and Support Center in Morganton, North Carolina, and currently works with people who have severe disabilities in schools, residential centers, and community living. His company has also employed adults with severe disabilities in a supported work capacity for the last 15 years.
