PRESENTER BIOGRAPHY

Dr. William L. Heward is Professor Emeritus at The Ohio State University, where he taught for 30 years. Internationally recognized for his work in two related fields, special education and applied behavior analysis, he has served as a Visiting Professor of Psychology at Keio University in Tokyo and as a Senior Fulbright Scholar in Portugal. Dr. Heward has been a consultant to local school districts, state education departments, and mental retardation agencies, and has conducted workshops for teachers throughout the U.S. and abroad. In 1985, he received Ohio State University's highest honor for teaching excellence: the Alumni Association's Distinguished Teaching Award.

The author or co-author of 8 books and more than 80 peer-reviewed research and conceptual papers in professional journals, Dr. Heward is currently working with his friends and colleagues John Cooper and Tim Heron on the second edition of their 1987 book, *Applied Behavior Analysis*, which is scheduled for publication later this year. Currently in its eighth edition, Dr. Heward's text, *Exceptional Children: An Introduction to Special Education*, has been used at more than 400 colleges and universities in the U.S. and translated into Spanish, Korean, and Japanese. Dr. Heward's current research focuses on "low-tech" methods that classroom teachers can use to increase the frequency with which each student actively responds and participates during group instruction and on methods for adapting curriculum and instruction to promote the generalization and maintenance of newly learned skills by students with disabilities.
